The Deacon's Corner

We've all had a bad day, week or month. It happens, life isn't always smooth and easy. We all have seasons that are quite challenging. I am certainly no exception to that rule. I understand.

Did you know that our Lord and Savior says the same thing, for the same reason? Did He know suffering? Did He know about abandonment? Is He familiar with physical pain? Was He ever tempted? Alone? The answer to all of these is a resounding YES!

Personally, I deal with a relentless pain that never ceases. It is difficult to function sometimes, due to this affliction. Have I prayed about this? Have I asked for a healing? Do I pray for a reason that I go through all this? Have I asked about what I am to do in this condition? The answer to all of these is a resounding YES!

The apostle Paul had a "thorn in his flesh" (2 Corinthians 12:7). We don't know what it was, really. We know he had troubles with his eyes, and possible other things too, Galatians 4:15 & Galatians 6:11. What has always stuck with me was that God never healed Paul. We know of at least three times, in Scripture, where Paul prayed for a healing. Yet it never came. At the same time, Paul was used, by the Spirit, to bring healing to others in their physical ailments. That is very interesting to me. Why was he not healed himself?

You would think that a powerfully blessed man like Paul would have received God's mercies in all areas of his life. Wouldn't he have been better able to serve without these afflictions? I suggest to you that just the opposite is true. What a much more powerful witness it is when we can say, "I understand", when we can say, "look how He has used me, I can't do this by myself." You know, right then and there, that it is God, and not man, who is working. When you can see the power, the strength, the miracle, with your own eyes, it means so much more.

I don't know why He has us in these situations, other than to say, "I understand that you are hurting", "I know it is hard, I can't do this by myself either", just "look to Him who is the author and finisher of our faith". That is how I get through it all. Do you get through your rough times with God? How about your easy times, with God? Busy times & quiet times, with God? Is the answer to all of these is a resounding YES?
