Be a Good Neighbor!

On June 8 we woke up to no electricity. There was no power for my C-pap machine. We were unable to charge our phones.

The refrigerator was not working and we were concerned that the food would spoil. We knew we would be OK during the daytime. We did not know how we were going to make it through the night. We attempted to call Edison and were unable to reach anyone. HOA was unable to provide any help. We called a neighbor from our former Spinning Wheel Dr home who checked the "power box" located in condo and informed us our power was turned off. I remember requesting start service before we moved. How could this have happened? Later that day we were able to make contact with SCE and found out that service was never turned on. New service was requested and expected the next day. Our new neighbor across the hallway was present and aware of our situation during the day as we inquired about any experience that she may have had. Before dawn our neighbor and her son showed up at our front door with work lamp and offered its use until service was restored. The neighbors gave us an unexpected "blessing" and God's timing is always perfect.

This reminded me of the early Christians who were committed to meet each other's needs and the welfare of their new found family.

Acts 4:32 states *"All the believers were one in heart and mind. No one claimed that any of the possessions was their own, but they shared everything they had."*

I am reminded that all of this could have been prevented if I had made sure that the initial request for service was confirmed. Avoiding mishaps like this can be preventable. Sin is a reality living in this world and sometimes we will mess up. The Psalmist wrote in **Psalm 119:11**, *"I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you."* Reading, memorizing, and meditating on God's word will help keep our mind and heart focused on Him, rather than falling into the world's "fleshly" solutions.

Paul and Barnabas were accountable to one another in Paul's early ministry. Later, Timothy and Titus would become those people to Saul of Tarsus, named Paul. We all need to be accountable to someone in our walk in Christ. Years ago, the Lord brought Alfredo Mount a 14-year missionary to Panama into my life to help me along the way. I will never forget him.
